**Tamar Valley** National Landscape

<b>Estimated time 90 minutes (ca. 1.7 miles)</b> This is a fabulous walk with amazing views across the Tamar Valley. We will be following the path from the lowest car park around to the back of the hill, then gradually working our way up to a short incline. The walk is on uneven footpaths, but definitely worth it when you reach the top!!	Gunnislake village and riverside Circular Estimated time 90 minutes (ca. 2.4 miles) A varied walk from the centre of Gunnislake village down to the Tamar riverbank footpath. The path can be very muddy and slippery in places with steep, rough ground, so good footwear is essential. No stiles. Well worth the effort with lovely views of the river and of the valley across to Chimney Rock as we climb back up to the centre of the village. Option to stop for refreshments in the village at the end of the walk.
Cotehele Circular  Estimated time 90 minutes (ca. 2.2 miles)  Starting at the Quay car park, taking the footpath up into the woods, passing the small chapel, then continuing uphill until turning back to pass through the upper car park and joining the road away from the house, before taking the gate on the left down through the woods to the river and back to the quay.	Calstock Higher Kelly Lane Circular Estimated time up to 90 minutes (ca. 1.6 miles) Lovely walk along footpaths and through wooded areas. Option to stop for refreshments in village afterwards.
Scrubtor Circular Estimated time 2 hours A lovely walk, through woodland, whilst passing remnants of the rich mining heritage of the area, with occasional glimpses of the River Tamar. Easy underfoot, mostly firm but muddy in places, with one steep section. Parking at Scrubtor car park is limited, so car sharing is advisable.  Bere Ferrers riverside to Hallowell Wood Circular Estimated time up to 75 minutes (ca. 1.8 miles) A very scenic route taking us along the Tavy riverbank with uninterrupted views of the estuary and then a short loop into the woodland. Using country lanes and public footpaths, moderate effort is required with some inclines but no stiles. Can be very muddy. No stiles.	Up and Around Hingston Down Circular Estimated time up to 2hrs (ca. 2.93 miles)  A walk along public footpaths up to Hingston Down with stunning views from the heathland across to Plymouth Sound. After reaching the Down, we take the lane back to the main road, before taking a footpath and country roads back to Albaston. Some steps and a small stream crossing, so appropriate footwear needed.  Tavistock Canal Circular Estimated time 2hrs (ca 4.3 miles)  The walk will follow the disused railway line along to Crowndale Viaduct. A path then drops down to the canal, through an old tunnel and under the canal and up to the towpath. We will then return to Tavistock along the canal, walking past historic Crowndale farm. Look out for the kingfisher and other water birds. Boots are recommended as the railway cutting can be wet in one area. One very steep short climb up to the canal.
Harrowbarrow Wheal Brothers Lane Circular  Estimated time up to 90 minutes (ca. 2.6 miles)  Fairly easy going on roadways, cart track, public footpaths through woodland and field with kissing gate and stiles. Some climbs and descents. Can be muddy so suitable footwear recommended.  To Calstock via Danescombe Valley  Estimated time 90 minutes (ca. 2.3 miles)  This is a fantastic walk through the Danescombe Valley ending in Calstock. On footpaths this walk does include some small downhill sections, including a steep field that can be slippery. Stiles and steps and a narrow path along the stream bank that can be very wet. Please bring bus fare or pass for return to Centre on 79/79A bus.	Morwellham Circular Estimated time 2hrs (ca. 4 miles) An interesting walk full of the history of Morwellham, starting on road, but mostly on tracks, including railway tracks, and footpaths. First half downhill, second half uphill, but we will take it at an easy pace. No stiles.  Bohetherick & Cotehele Mill Circular Estimated time up to 2hrs (ca. 2.25 miles) A moderate walk ascending through old market gardens to Bohetherick, a once bustling hamlet on the Edgcumbes' Cotehele estate, before returning to the Quay via Cotehele Mill.
Siblyback Reservoir Circular Estimated time 2hrs (ca. 3.11 miles) An easy level walk around this scenic reservoir on a good path, may be some puddles but otherwise very clean track. Toilets and a café are available part way around.
